POLICY

In accordance with Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) Sponsoring Institutional Requirements, neither Lancaster General Hospital (LGH), as the Sponsoring Institution, nor any of its ACGME accredited programs, will require a resident or fellow to sign a restrictive covenant or non-competition guarantee as part of his or her resident contract.

PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to enable compliance with the ACGME Sponsoring Institutional Requirement that a Sponsoring Institution must maintain a policy which states that neither the Sponsoring Institution nor any of its ACGME-accredited programs will require a resident/fellow to sign a non-competition guarantee or restrictive covenant (III.B.5.a).(1).

SCOPE

This policy applies to all LGH sponsored ACGME accredited training programs.

IMPLEMENTATION AND ADMINISTRATION

The implementation of this policy is the responsibility of the LGH Designated Institutional Official, the Office of Academic Affairs, and Program Directors.

PROCEDURE

Neither LGH, as the Sponsoring Institution, nor any of its ACGME accredited programs, will require a resident or fellow to sign a restrictive covenant or non-competition guarantee as part of his or her resident contract.
